Working Together to Help Prevent Hospital-Acquired Pneumonia (HAP)

Implementing an oral care program for all patients is an indispensable part of national efforts to protect patients from hospital-acquired pneumonia (HAP). HAP is the second most common hospital-acquired infection in the United States.¹

For many years, a great deal of emphasis has been placed on ventilator-associated pneumonia (VAP), which occurs in nearly 90 percent of mechanically ventilated patients in intensive care.¹ Numerous professional healthcare organizations have developed oral care guidelines and protocols to help prevent VAP. Meanwhile pneumonia occurring in non-ventilated patients—which accounts for 11 percent of healthcare-acquired infections outside of intensive care¹—has been largely ignored.

More recently, non-ventilator HAP has begun receiving more attention. A link was made between widespread HAP and patients' lack of ability or energy to maintain daily oral care. As a result, microbes in the mouth multiply, making it more likely for bacteria to be aspirated into the patient's lungs, which can then cause pneumonia.²

Enhanced oral care for both ventilated and non-ventilated patients

A study conducted in 2012 involved an enhanced oral care protocol for a group of non-intubated, care-dependent adults. Oral care kits, including toothbrushes, swabs and hydrogen peroxide, were placed at every patient's bedside, and nurses were required to follow an oral cleaning protocol.³

The study showed a significant drop in pneumonia rates. The enhanced oral care group had a 6.3 percent rate of HAP, compared to the baseline group, with a rate of 25.5 percent.³

24-HOUR ORAL CARE FOR VENTILATED PATIENTS

Ventilated patients are at the highest risk for infection and therefore require the most intensive oral care regimen. Based on industry guidelines, care should be administered on a Q2 or Q4 schedule to help reduce the risk factors associated with ventilator-associated pneumonia (VAP).

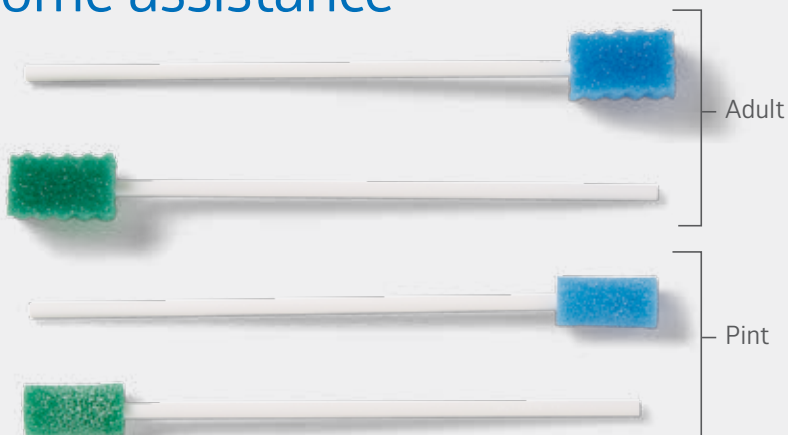
